This volume forms a very important contribution to the sciences of ethnology and folklore. The book is almost equally divided between the reprint of Tyson s pamphlet and the editor s Introduction, of which the latter is vastly the more interesting:, although the former contains much that is deserving of consideration. And the argument advanced by Tyson is that the pygmies, the cynocephali, the satyrs and sphinges of the ancients, were either apes or monkeys, and not men, as formerly pretended. This, however, says Prof. Windle, is a theory which has been demolished by the discoveries of the present century.
